PREMIER GRADE PREVIEW



Premier rugby is well and truly into the swing of things after round three, with a full slate of action across the grades last Saturday showcasing the quality footy around the Capital.

Gungahlin may have been turned over late in the John I Dent Cup, but in the lower premier grades, the Eagles were unbeaten.

In 2's, the Eagles looked dominant on their way to a 36-22 victory in their Grand-Final rematch against Tuggeranong, while the Gungahlin 3's demolished Vikings 78-7, Kylan Edwards scoring four tries.

4th Grade was the tightest affair, with Gungahlin winning 29-22.

Out at Queanbeyan, it was a similar story for the Whites with 4th and 3rd grade notching impressive wins. Queanbeyan's title defence in 4's has begun without blemish, their 26-10 victory being almost matched by their 3's, 19-10.

The Whites didn't have it all their way however, the Owls taking full spoils from 2nd grade 13-3 and of course in the John I Dent Cup, 35-0.

Wests 4th Grade outfit continue to impress, and their latest offering may just be their best so far. Coming away with a 43-10 win at Phillip Oval against Royals, the side set the tone for their 1st grade charges who won their first game of the year.

Royals had the better of 2nd and 3rd grade however, cruising home to big wins in both games, 34-15 in 3's and 31-17 in 2's.

Royals face a tricky trip across state lines to Campese Oval this Saturday, particularly in 4th grade where the Whites will look to stay perfect.

Wests will be hoping to match pace with Queanbeyan against the Tuggeranong Vikings at Jamison Oval while there are a number of fascinating fixtures set for ANU North Oval, with the Owls welcoming the Eagles for the 'Battle of the Birds'.

Gungahlin, they've the strike power to beat anyone on their day, and by a lot of points. There will be a game this season, where you look up the results and your jaw hits the floor because Gungahlin have put 50+ on a team.

It's probably not going to be this week. Uni are too good now, but throw out the first three rounds, this is a standalone battle. It's THE battle. The Battle of the Birds.

game. There have been good signs for the defending champions, but they have been unable to close out games when it is needed.

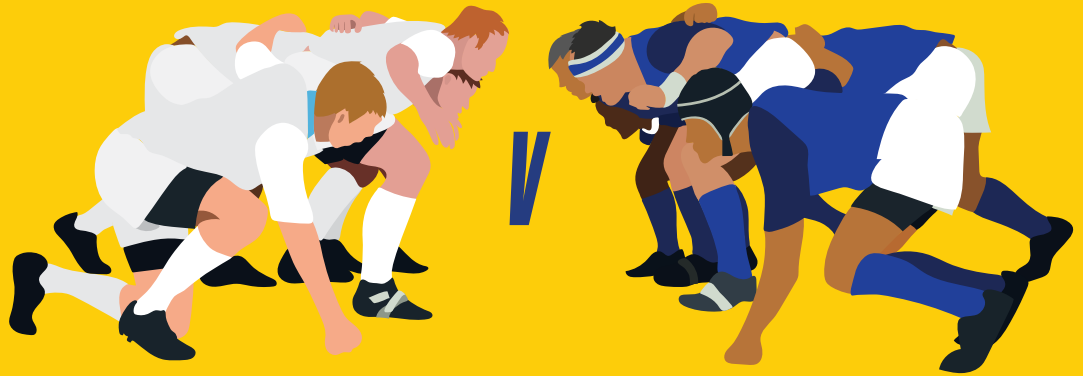
