It's not a case of do or die for the Queanbeyan Whites or Gungahlin at Campese Oval today, but neither side will want to stare down a 5 loss, 1 win record.

For the Eagles, that prospect is probably a bit more dour than the Whites. Tipped as favourites before the truncated season, Gungahlin are reeling from four defeats in a row.

Their last three, to be fair, have come against Vikings, Owls and Royals, all games where the Eagles were firmly in the contest but the side seem to be still recovering from their round two loss, against their opponents today.

For Gungahlin, they'll either relish today's challenge as a chance to bury the memory of round two, or they will fear a confident Whites outfit who know they can beat them and are rarely easy outs at home.
