The Plus500 Brumbies are in sparkling form having won two from two to start the 2021 season and now look ahead to their stiffest test to date against the Melbourne Rebels.

A hard-fought win in WA against the Force was followed by a record, 61-10 win over the NSW Waratahs at the Brumbies fortress GIO Stadium last Saturday night.

The Melbourne Rebels will be stinging after letting a golden chance to turn over tournament favourites the Queensland Reds on their home patch.

Dave Wessels' side outmuscled the Reds at Suncorp for 79 minutes and had a kick to win it at the death but Matt To'omua's missed penalty goal meant they left without the treats.

The performance caught the eye of many, however. The Rebels set piece was a real highlight, something the Brumbies coaches would have been keenly aware of.

With Joe Powell now in the Rebels ranks, Melbourne have added direction and organisation, and with To'omua and Reece Hodge, the Rebels have two sharpshooters who can punish the Brumbies if they are undisciplined.

The Rebels elite trait is their work at the breakdown. In defence, they target the ball hard, especially in Hodge and To'omua's range. Depending on the whistle direction, that's a chance to go to the corner for the Brumbies, or 3 points for the visitors.

In attack, they hold the ball, frustrating the opposition into conceding a penalty, which they duly knock over the crossbar for 3.

It's effective, and the Rebels have pace and power out-wide to capitalize if you don't respect them there too.

This is going to be a dogfight, if the Rebels win any sort of markers physically. That will be the Brumbies biggest challenge.

At least on form, the Brumbies will be favoured if they can match the Rebels intensity. They are connected, forced to go on the road once again. They will bring furious intent, and the Brumbies must rise to that.



- JOE POWELL

Former Brumbies halfback Joe Powell's addition to this Melbourne Rebels side was evident in the team's performance against the Reds last week.

BIG LOSS

- DANE HAYLETT-PETTY

X-FACTOR

- REECE HODGE

If given the chance, Reece Hodge could legitimately convert a penalty on his own 22m line into 3 points. His presence on the field means teams are genuinely concerned they will concede points any time they're inside 60m from their own goal.

In theory, that means teams cannot force the issue at the ruck, stupid penalties leading to stupid points. It also means that if the Rebels are within striking distance on the scoreboard, they always feel they have a shot at winning.
