## TOP FOUR CONFIRMED AFTER OWLS VICTORY

Uni-Norths Owls booked their place in the 2019 Griffin Legal John I Dent Cup playoffs with a statement victory over Queanbeyan in Round 15.

While Gungahlin and Royals continued their dominant streaks, it was the Owls who stole the headlines, cementing their spot in the finals against the Whites, who were hoping to mount a late season charge for a fourth place finish.

50-27 told the story of a game where Owls seemed to finally put it together after an up and down season. There were signs in round 14 that Uni were starting to turn a corner, and against Queanbeyan, they sparked. Now, with a playoff berth secured; the Owls can look to build for finals and with a number of front line players still coming back to form, any side which has to face them will have their work cut out.

That team is likely to be the defending champions, Vikings with Gungahlin and both registering dominant wins. On their charity day, the Eagles looked impressive again against Wests, winning 47-12 at Nicholls Enclosed Oval.

Impressive loosehead prop Ray Dobson has been in career form this year, and bagged himself a hattrick in the Eagles win. Gungahlin have lost just one game in 2019, and will likely finish as minor premiers if they can turn over Royals today.

The Blue Baggers will have their say in that matter though. Royals have been equally

impressive this season, losing that sole fixture against Vikings is the only blemish on an otherwise perfect record. Their latest offering, a 71-14 victory away from home against Easts rubber stamped just how good Royals can be.

Incredibly, both Pedro Rolando and rookie phenom Rory Scott scored three tries a piece in the rout, and are likely to play a significant role in Royals run for another premiership. Today's matchup between the league leaders could have real significance moving forward.

If Gungahlin win, they'll almost certainly finish top of the heap, which would be an remarkable achievement for Marco Caputo's charges in their first season under the former Brumbies rake. Should Royals take home the chocolates, they'll have a chance to finish top but they do still have to play Vikings in the final round.

Looking to third place, Tuggeranong play Wests today knowing they can still move into those top two places. Tuggeranong will have added incentive as they host their annual Hagar's Day celebrating the clubs proud history. Owls have the bye, a chance for them to reset the charges before beginning their hunt for a title.

So, even though the playoff spots are confirmed, we still have so much to play for in these final two rounds. History shows us that seeding can mean everything and nothing, but what is always important, is momentum.

# RUGBY IN THE MILITARY FORGES FRIENDSHIPS

Rugby in the defence force has a long history in Canberra. Royal Military College Duntroon (or RMC) were one of the founding clubs of the ACT Rugby Union and, along with a proud history, they have developed some great lasting relationships with clubs around the region. One such relationship is the strong bond between RMC and the Australian Defence Force Academy (ADFA). A lot of young up and coming army officers spend three years with the ADFA club while completing their studies before moving on to play with RMC.

Lewis Crothers is the club president of RMC and, going back ten years, he was one of these players. This time around he has only been involved with the club for less than a year but is enjoying his time back with them.

“The transition happens and its purely based on your work lifestyle,” Crothers said. “So, you’ll do three years as an army officer trainee at Australian Defence Force Academy and play rugby for them, and

then the next progression is to go to the Royal Military College Duntroon to finish off your officer training. You’ll end up just playing rugby for them for that year, so it’s the natural progression for all army trainees who play rugby.”

Asked about the rivalry between the teams, Crothers said it’s only natural for such similar clubs to have a bit of competition between them. The games between the two are often tightly contested and always pull a huge crowd.

“There’s always going to be a rivalry between two similar organisations and you know it’s been going back since 1986 when the Australian Defence Force Academy joined the competition,” Crothers admitted. “It’s just a good opportunity to have two young teams that are probably similar in age and demographic be able to have a hit out. And with big support from the whole college of about 500 people and the whole academy of about 1000 people come down and watch a spectacle of rugby that’s pretty entertaining.

“This year was excellent, we managed to have it on Anzac Day eve, so we could tie it in and have a military day that was themed around the military occasion, yeah it was quite the spectacle. It’s young fellas playing a game that we really enjoy and it’s a great club atmosphere.”

Mitchell Egan is the ADFA Rugby Club President. He got involved with ADFA Rugby in his first year at the club; he had been playing rugby a bit beforehand and decided to keep playing and be involved with the club at ADFA.

“We get guys that have played before hand,” Egan commented. “But then at other times boys, and girls as well, just come in and want to give it a crack. Heaps of people from not just first year, but second year and third year, come through and just want to play footy or be involved with the club.”

ADFA has fielded a women’s rugby team in the ACT competition since 1998. The teams have since built a strong reputation in the competition and help build the women’s format of the game.

“All my three years that I’ve been at the club there have been [women’s] teams playing sevens, tens and fifteens,” Egan said. “We find we get along really well. We just form a team and make it work. We have a lot of respect for each other and that helps a lot with developing that culture in the club.”



Discussing the relationship between ADFA and RMC, Egan said that it’s common for the team to face off against former teammates who had progressed past their third year at the academy.

“We find that most players, if they’re third year, they go over,” Egan said. “We see a lot of our old mates on the team if we play RMC, and that’s quite good to have some friendly competition there.

“Alongside AFL and soccer, rugby is one of the biggest sports at ADFA. I guess for us to have a rugby club is a great way to take a break from your academics and your military studies and it’s great to play rugby and have team culture have some fun with mates and build those lasting relationships as well.”

It’s a relationship that shows no signs of slowing down.

Local product Michaela Leonard was one of the stars of the show as the Wallaroos notched their first ever win on home soil last Saturday.

The dynamic Vi-Queens lock didn't look a step out of place in her international debut, filling the stat sheet with carries, tackles and clean breaks in her 80 minute bow.

Leonard has been growing her reputation has one of the best young talents in Australia over the past couple of seasons both with the Brumbies and Tuggeranong, and this latest leap up the ladder showed just how far the 24 year old has come, having only played her first game of 15's rugby at the start of 2018.

Back home, Leonard's Vi-Queens teammates were unable to upset the prematch form guide against Uni-Norths, with the Owls winning 20-0 at ANU North Oval. Tuggeranong could still leapfrog Owls into second place with victory over Royals today, though they would take Wests pulling out a major upset at Weetangera against the Owls.

Still, Tuggies will want to keep up their resurgent late season form, especially given that finishing in that third spot gives you

an extra chance at the Grand-Final. As a reminder, Easts (who are on a bye this week) will finish top and have another week off in the first of the three weeks of finals.

Second place, likely to be Uni-Norths Owls will play third, while fourth will play fifth. In week two, the winner of second v third will then play Easts, in the major semi-final with the winner booking passage to the big dance.

The loser of second v third will play the winner of fourth versus fifth, in the elimination semi-final, thus creating your standard finals setup. The winner of this game will then have a chance to make the grand-final against the loser of the major semi-final, the winner of the major semi-final of course earning themselves another week off and a guaranteed place in the Grand-Final. ## GUNGAHLIN SECURE TOP SPOT WITH WESTS WIN

The Gungahlin Eagles soar above the rest in First Division 1st Grade in 2019, at least in the regular season, after beating Wests in Round 13, 22-7, dynamo flanker Mitch Colbert putting on a dazzling display with two tries and a smattering of other key involvements. ADFA completed the top-four sweep with victory over Cooma, and nipping at their heels in the hunt for fourth place are Hall who helped themselves to a handsome win over Vikings, 47-12. James Thornhill's hatrick inspired the Bushrangers away to Tuggeranong, giving them a shot at sneaking into the playoffs this week.

Queanbeyan's hopes of mounting a postseason charge are over despite recording a sensational win away to the Owls, 64-7. The Whites had 10 different names on the scoresheet in the clash at ANU North Oval, inside centre John Steele adding seven conversions to his meat pie in the 70th minute.

In the final round of the regular season, there is still much to play for. Eagles are guaranteed first, but they'll want to leave a shot on Royals for the finals. Beating Royals would mean Goulburn would finish second, who will still want to make sure of their position in second against Queanbeyan. Hall will hope victory over Cooma will give them passage to the playoffs but that will rely on ADFA losing against bottom places Easts. Elsewhere around the grounds, Vikings take on Wests and RMC are in action against the Uni-Norths Owls.
