2019 was an exhilarating year of local rugby, the top two battling on Grand-Final day with Royals coming away as victors, reversing 2018's result with a 32-31 victory over Tuggeranong.

The early part of the year belonged to Gungahlin, the Eagles bursting out of the blocks right from Round 1 when they defeated the previous year's Premiers Tuggeranong 29-26. That trend continued winning six games on the trot before suffering their 1st defeat of 2019 to eventual Champions Canberra Royals.

Round 17 saw Tuggeranong defeat Canberra Royals by 5 points to claim the minor premiership, with Royals sitting in second.

The Uni-North Owls were comfortably 4th, cementing their final series spot with a 23-point thumping of Queanbeyan in Round 15.

The tenacious students did one better than 2018 making the Preliminary Final against Tuggeranong following a 25-19 defeat of the high-flying Gungahlin Eagles and came agonisingly close to their 1st Grand Final appearance as a merged entity going down by 3 points to Tuggeranong.

Queanbeyan Whites could view their season as one of what if's and lost opportunity. The team from across the border couldn't

improve on their ladder position from last season despite showing plenty of promise against the teams placed lower than themselves but couldn't bring it together against the top sides.

Wests 2017 Grand Final appearance continued to be a distant memory for the boys from Belconnen. The Lions kicked off their 2019 campaign with a stunning 47-point draw with grand finalists Tuggeranong but couldn't get the consistency on the paddock to send long term coach Craig Robberds out with a bang.

Easts suffered what only can be described as second year syndrome under coach Tim Cornforth. The men from the Eastern Suburbs could only muster one win for 2019, but what a win it was defeating Gungahlin Eagles 32-22 in what was the biggest upset of the year.

While most would have heavily backed a Royals/ Vikings Grand Final, the competition again threw up twists and turns as it careered its way to the Grand Prize.

The 81st year of Premier Rugby in the ACT was just as exciting as the previous 80. We can't wait for the 82nd in 2020.

Canberra Royals take on the Uni Norths Owls at Phillip Oval at 3:05pm this Saturday the 18th of July.



BOB HITCHCOCKTERRITORY SHIELD UPDATE





Vale Bob Hitchcock: Territory Shield takes on deeper meaning with Legend's passing

Following the passing of its namesake in January, the Bob Hitchcock Territory Shield will take on an even deeper meaning in 2020.

Vikings will defend the Shield in round one, after claiming the Shield in 2019.

Named for a legend of ACT Rugby, Hitchcock began his contribution to rugby in the region as a player with the Queanbeyan Rugby Union Club before later coaching both the junior and senior teams from the Whites over a decade-long period.

His coaching career continued to flourish, leading numerous age groups and the ACT Senior team whilst also mentoring the Australian Under-21s, Emerging Wallabies, Australian Women (including the 1998 and 2002 Rugby World Cups) and the Australian Women's Sevens between 1990 and 2002. He was named ACT Coach of the Year on two occasions.

Off the field, Hitchcock was passionate about developing talent identification programs for local players and was also highly involved in the AIS rugby scholarship program from its inception until

After his coaching and playing days were over, Hitchcock continued to demonstrate his long term commitment to rugby, with his involvement with the ACTORS (ACT Old Rugby Society)

In 1995, he was formally recognised for his contribution to rugby in the region and was awarded Life Membership of the ACT and Southern NSW Rugby Union before being named in the ACT Sport Hall of Fame in 2012. Hitchcock was also a recipient of the Medal of the Order of Australia.

Brumbies Chairman Matt Nobbs paid tribute to Hitchcock's influence on rugby in the community after his passing in January.

"It's hard to imagine someone other than Bob who has made such a significant contribution to rugby in the region over such a long period of time," Nobbs said.

"He was a really great bloke to spend time with and was highly respected by all in the rugby community.

"Bob had an incredible career and devoted his life, mostly as a volunteer to the game he loved. Our thoughts are with his family during this time."


