OLD RIVARIES RENEWED FOR TOP TWO SEEDS

The winding roads of each season have been very different, but for the past three years, Tuggeranong Vikings and Canberra Royals have duked it out for an automatic place in the Grand-Final. Their history, intertwined through the years, dominates modern ACT club rugby. Last season, it was Royals who won this fixture, though it would be the Vikings who would win the final game of the year.

In 2017, again it was the Blue Baggers winning at the qualification final stage and they would go on to capture an unbeaten premiership two weeks later. This season, Royals were unbeatable, unless it was against Vikings. Every season it seems to come down to these two and this game is going to go down to the wire. Ultimately, as it always seems to be with these Vikings and Royals, whomever takes their chances and makes the fewest errors will win.

The margins are usually that small. Their first meeting this year was an example of what can happen when Vikings get on a roll. Royals were beaten, badly at home to the champions, Royals just not showing up on the day. Last week, it was a much different game and Royals showed that they can hang with Vikings at full strength, though it was still Nick Scrivener's men who came out on top. So, recent history favours Vikings.

Why shouldn't they be favoured? Despite not playing their best rugby at times this year, the Vikings have looked seriously good lately, particularly since getting back to full strength. What was so impressive, was how Scrivener's side improved over the season, particularly the young players that were forced to grow up quickly as players at times during their run to the minor premiership.

They're not unbeatable though, of course not. Royals have the tools, the togetherness to get the job done on any day. They work hard for each other and pull absolutely no punches. Expect a rough and confrontational battle in this game, as Royals will try to take this fight into the later rounds.

All signs point to a Vikings win. They have the squad, they have a winning culture and they have the form. They'll respect Royals, and they'll have to because the Blue Bagger brigade will be out in force, and normally come finals time, Royals start to lift. The champions path normally passes through the qualifying finals. Wisdom says it's Vikings to lose, but anything can happen in playoff rugby.



EAGLES AIMING TO SOAR IN SECOND GRADE & COLTS

It's Qualification Final time in the Premier Division lower grades of ACT & SNSW Rugby. The action on Saturday sees the Qualification Finals, formerly the Major Semi-Final, as the teams ranked one and two in their respective grades go head-to-head for a spot in the Grand Final. The victors will progress whilst the vanquished will head to next week's preliminary Final for one last shot at glory.

In the Premier Division Second Grade competition the Qualification Final pits the undefeated Gungahlin Eagles against the Tuggeranong Vikings with the Eagles, who are fourteen from fourteen and who finished thirteen points ahead of their rivals, favoured to take the next step to the big dance.

The teams' first encounter in 2019 was way back in Round 1 at Viking Park where the Eagles snuck home 33-31 in a thriller, with Miseli Sinoti and Claude Edwards both claiming a brace of tries. Vikings crossed for four of their own and, despite the kicking of Jayden Edwards who landed four conversions and a penalty, couldn't take home the points.

In Round 6 there was more of the same, but this time the Eagles were 19-11 winners, Liam Colley with two of the trio of Eagles five-pointers on that occasion and the Gungahlin side made it

three from three with a 36-21 Round 13 success at Nicholls Enclosed. They scored five tries in that match with Adam Rummery the latest to get two to his name.

At Colts level, the Eagles finished top of the pile by nine points from Canberra Royals, but neither side was invincible as the Eagles were beaten twice and Royals four times during the regular season. Eagles defeated Royals in their opening clash of this season, the 34-17 Round 9 victory in which the home side, the Eagles, crossed for half-a-dozen tries.

In the only other match-up, in Round 16 at Phillip Oval, it was a much more even contest, the Eagles winning 19-14 as Liam Bashford, Lachlan Carey and Isaac Crowe outscored the Royals three tries to two, Thomas Hallam and Liam Maguire crossing for the host. So, Eagles will be favourites, but there might not be much in it come the final whistle.

OWLS AND EAGLES AIM TO LAND KNOCKOUT BLOW

Exactly one year ago, Gungahlin Eagles faced off against the Uni-Norths Owls in the elimination final, and once again they'll battle it out at Viking Park for a spot in the next round.

The fixture may be identical, but the circumstances are very different to last year. In 2018, the Eagles were on a high entering the finals. Wrote off from contention halfway through the year, the Eagles made a stunning comeback to make the playoffs and made the preliminary final thanks to victory over the Owls.

All year long, Gungahlin have seemed a shoo-in to play in the qualification final, earning the two bites at the cherry thanks to superb league form. The fact they're playing today is incredible, and it was all down to that final round loss to Easts, which nobody saw coming.

Gungahlin know all about the Owls work on the floor. In their most recent matchup, Uni-Norths dominated the clear out area. They just never let the Eagles get comfortable, bashing the point of contact so that's definitely something to watch out for in this game.

However, in the end it didn't matter in that game. Gungahlin were ultimately too good for the Owls that day and won in both their meetings this season. Every smart bet two weeks ago would have had them finishing top. Their collapse would be insane, going from red hot title favourites to gone in a matter of weeks, but the smart money will still favour the Eagles.

It's going to be a fascinating game. For Owls, it's a free shot. They'll feel they can live with the Eagles upfront and will look to use their kicking game to put the pressure on Gungahlin. The pressure is on the Eagles, but they'll relish that and though they may have finished third in the end, they'll go into this game knowing that momentum can sometimes be as good as a week off, if their premiership dream is to be realised.

WHITES OUT FOR PROGRESSION IN SECONDS AND COLTS ELIMINATIONS

It's do-or-die for the teams left in the Elimination Finals for the Premier Division Second Grade and Colts competitions this weekend as the losers will see their 2019 season draw to a conclusion with the winners progressing to the Preliminary Finals next week.

In Second Grade, Canberra Royals, who finished thirteen points better off than Queanbeyan Whites, will be confident they can make the next stage, especially having won two of their three encounters with the Whites in a fairly convincing manner, the first by 36-19 in Round 1, a game in which Hayden Egerton claimed two Royals tries.

Johnny Lalatoa claimed two of the four home tries with Billy Carberry, one try and two conversions, doing his best to keep the Vikings in touch.

STEP CLOSER TO GRAND FINAL IN FIRST DIVISION

One of Gungahlin Eagles or ADFA will book their place in the First Division First Grade Grand Final this weekend as the pair meet at Viking Park on Saturday morning in the Qualification Final with the loser consigned to next week's last-chance shot in the Preliminary Final showdown.

Steele had a finals match to remember as he also claimed a try and conversion to go with his two successful penalties, ending the match with thirteen of the eighteen points the Whites recorded. Sam Oliver and Joshua Brain crossed for hall, with James Murphy kicking a conversion and penalty. The Whites reward, a knock-out Elimination Final with the Dirty Reds, promises to provide a tense, and exciting tie.
