Yet even though the Owls beat the Eagles last time they met they can't get too cocky, as the Eagle squad looks revamped and determined to push themselves back into contention.

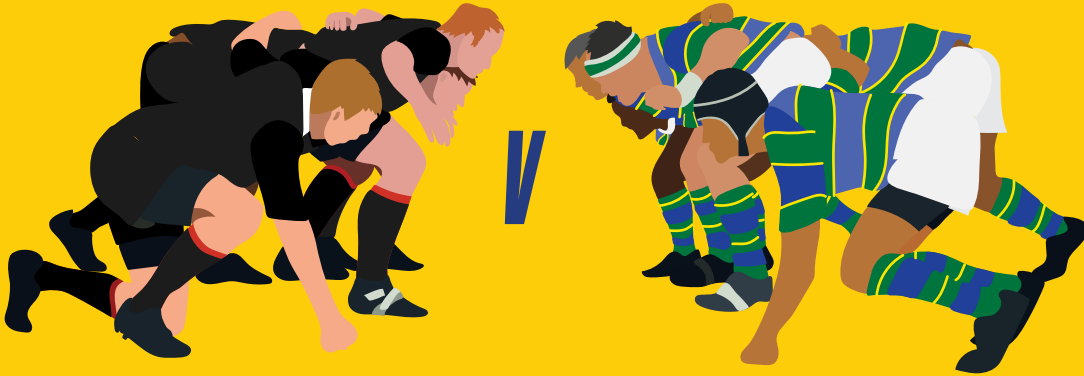
Will the Owls maintain their dominance over the competition and add another one under their belt? Or will we see an upset made by the underdog Eagles squad?

The Canberra Royals will take on the Queanbeyan Whites at Phillip Oval, with the hosts looking to extend their streak of wins to five in round eight of the John I Dent Cup.

It took until round four for the Royals to recapture last seasons premiership winning form, where they comfortably beat the Whites 23-7 in their previous meeting in Queanbeyan.

Also, keep a look out for winger Ben Johnston for the Royals, as Johnston currently sits equal second in tries for 2020 with five and Argentine magician Pedro Rolando, who has put in several strong performances for the hosts over the course of the season.

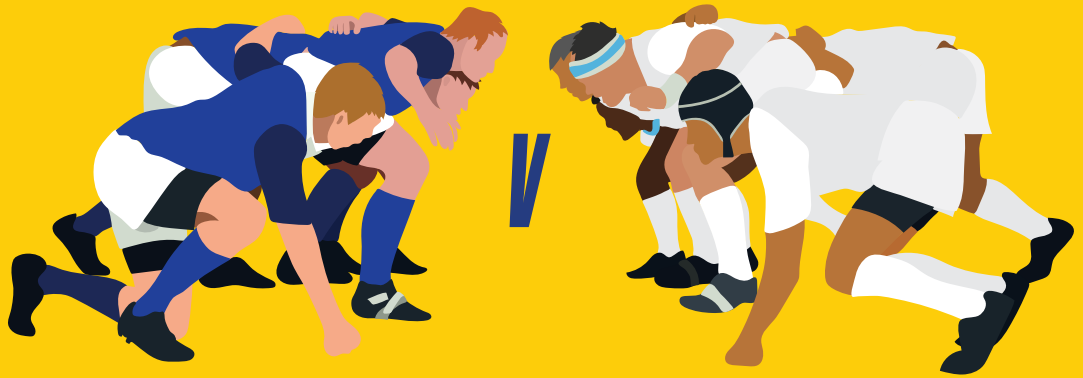
