It's hard to believe, but there are now just four rounds left in the Griffin Legal John I Dent Cup regular season. The season has been largely dictated by the top three sides, the Eagles, Vikings and Royals and in Round 13, Tuggeranong made the trip to Nicholls, hoping to knock Gungahlin off their perch.

In a back and forth affair, ultimately the 80 minutes of action wasn't enough to separate the two sides. 33-33 was in some ways the fair result on a day where both teams failed to reach top gear.

Vikings were without a number of frontline players, so perhaps they got the better of the tie, especially given Nicholls enclosed is a tough place to go and win. However, given that Tuggies had a commanding lead in the latter stages of the piece, they will probably still feel this one was a win that got away.

The same could be said for Easts who had their best chance to claim a win this season against Uni-Norths but just couldn't hang on the second half. With half an hour to play, the Suburbs were up 33-21 at ANU, but thanks to some inspirational play from halfback Lachlan Creighton, the Owls were able to claw themselves back into the game and ended up taking a maximum five points out of the game, 40-25.

Finally, at Jamison Oval the Queanbeyan Whites continued their upward trajectory this season with a convincing, 50-14 win away to Wests. The visitors systematically shutdown Wests throughout the game, scoring some breathtaking tries in the process. Raw results haven't been in Queanbeyan's favour of late, but their play has steadily increased the past couple of weeks and their win against the Lions should serve as a catalyst for a late season charge for finals.

Out at Griffith Oval, Easts face the challenge of the defending Champions, Vikings. It was a tough day at the office for Tim Cornforth's charges in their last encounter, Easts suffering an 80-15 drubbing at the hands of Tuggeranong. Expect this one to be a little closer, though if the potential reinforcements Vikings could be getting back today in the likes of Noah Lolesio, Angus Wagner and Darcy Swain, it may be another long day for the Beasties.

Livestreaming from Nicholls Enclosed, the Eagles take on the Owls. Gungahlin have come out on top so far in the battle of the birds but will have their work cut out for them welcoming an Owls side full of confidence after getting home last time out, while Queanbeyan take on Royals at Campese Field in what could be a crutial clash for Queanbeyan's top 4 aspirations.

TRACATOERS SETTIONES SANDARD

Taralga is a town with a long rugby history. In fact, the first rugby game played in Taralga was over 100 years ago in 1886, when the local team would play against Goulburn and Crookwell. The rugby club eventually folded as rugby league took over in popularity but was reformed in 2000 and has been a staple of the community ever since.

Taralga Tigers coach Evan Rees played a part in this regional rugby revival back in 2000 and he now takes on the responsibility of being the club's Vice-President on top of his coaching duties. The reigning premiers of the South Coast Monaro competition have carried their success into 2019 and are currently enjoying another stellar season.

The Tigers are undefeated after twelve games, impressively amassing a bonus point in all but one of their victories. According to Rees, their dominance comes down to having the right players, the right environment, and the right mindset.

"I think it's just the group of players we've got really. They're all pretty good mates on and off the field, they enjoy each other's company," Rees said. "They set their own standard and yeah, there's no secret to it is there. It's just hard work."

As Rees reflects on the team and its players, it becomes evident just how close knit the community is and how that impacts the playing group. "We've got cousins, the Croker cousins, we've got Bennett brothers, we've got brothers-in-law," laughed Rees. "Yeah they're all cousins or related or mates, it's a small community."



Reading the team sheet, it's hard not to notice the Croker's and the Bennetts, but there is also Taralga's captain and number 8 William Hedley, who recently played his 200th game for the club over an impressive 16-year playing career, who is brother-in-law to inside centre Sam Conlon. Pete Aparti as well, is brother-in-law with the Bennett brothers.

Having a group that all know each other so well surely helps them find success as a team. Not only are a lot of these players connected with each other off the field, they also connect with each other during games. Joel Croker, the team's five-eighth and goalkicker, is the competitions leading point scorer, racking up over 160 points already in a dozen games this season. Rees says he is a real sharpshooter with the boot and it's easy to believe him when you read the stats.

Rees also mentions the team's young hooker Isaac Elliott. Isaac is only 21 years old and has huge potential; his older brother Carl plays first grade for the Queanbeyan Whites and is well known in the ACT competition for his ability and aggression. Rees coached him as a schoolboy at Trinity in Goulburn so has known the family for quite some time.

This week the Taralga Tigers are coming up against the bottom-of-the-table Broulee

Dolphins. The team will make the 3 hour, 217km bus trip down to the coast but the Tigers Head Coach says some of the players really enjoy their away matches. The long trips for away games, which see them travel all the way to Jindabyne occasionally, are a quite unique aspect of the competition.

"It's funny because some blokes really like it, the bus trip. But I guess it's a lot harder playing away," says Rees. "You get up a bit easier when you're playing at home in front of your home crowd so there's a mental aspect to it. Stepping off that bus and being ready to play, it's quite hard sometimes. Your heads not in the game until after half time really."

The South Coast Monaro competition, a vibrant social league, is vital for small rugby communities, as it brings the towns together in a family-friendly, healthy, social environment.

"It's pretty important in bringing the town together," Rees admitted. "The majority of our players are local boys, if they're not local they're mates of the blokes who are. All of our sponsorship comes from local businesses; we get a lot of support from the Taralga Sports Club who are our major sponsor. We also get a lot of parents coming to games as well as girlfriends and wives.

"Just being a small community it's amazing how much support you get as a club and its very important for the district to have a team. It's a social thing really isn't it? It's a lot of travel but we enjoy playing in the country comp, it's a completely different atmosphere than the professional side of things, most of them work as tradesmen these days and they just enjoy playing footy together and socialising."

The seemingly unstoppable Taralga Tigers juggernaut has continued its relentless march towards yet another South Coast Monaro 2nd Division title with a twelfth win in succession in the competition. Their latest win, which moves them to 59 points out of a possible 60 saw the Tigers claim yet another bonus-point success.

Yass Rams were the Tigers latest victims with the Tigers waltzing over for nine tries in a 59-12 hammering. Joel Croker claimed one and kicked six conversions with James Marmont adding a brace and landing a conversion of his own. Brendyn Lonesborough crossed twice as the Tigers asserted their dominance, further tries added by Steven Anable, Benjamin Thomas and Dale Graham.

Bungendore Mudchooks fought gallantly to the last but succumbed 39-24 at the full-time whistle to the Batemans Bay Boars at Hanging Rock Rugby Oval on the coast. The Mudchooks were outscored five tries to four with three of their scores coming from Joe Nagauna, Ratu Jone Pio Macanawai and Lochlan Bannerman. Bannerman adding two kicks from the tee.

Crookwell Dogs meanwhile are in second place, some seventeen points adrift of the Tigers as they continued their rebuilding phase with a narrow 18-15 win over the Braidwood Redbacks at Crookwell RU. The Redbacks actually outscored the home side by three tries to two but had a dreadful day with the boot, missing all three conversions whilst Liam Jones nabbed one conversion and two penalties for the Dogs which, ultimately, proved

to be the difference between the sides. Jindabyne Bushpigs ran in sixteen-tries in their mammoth 86-0 mauling of Broulee Dolphins at the Jindabyne Sport Ground. The Bushpigs bonus-point success saw Dylan Johnson cross for three tris and kick seven conversions for a 29-point personal tally on a memorable afternoon for him.

Other tries were shared around the Bushpigs squad with Jared Cummins, Samuel Pfitzner, Jake Roarty and Ben Kuner going over for doubles with Chris Marshall, Simon Rudd, Cooper Swan, Mat Bruton and Jarome Waitohi completing the scoring.

The Dolphins task doesn't get any easier as they welcome the high-flying Tigers to Captain Oldrey Park in Round 13 with the Redbacks, meeting the Bushpigs, the Boars hosting the rams and the Mudchooks going head-to-head with the Dogs, rounding out the latest fixture.

Easts Women's Rugby club have opened up a six-point cushion at the top of the ACT Women's Premiership after they defeated Uni-Norths Owls in the top-of-the-table clash at the Australian National University, coming away with a bonus-point win in a 44-12 success.

The league leaders fashioned eight tries in their big victory, two each coming from Danielle Gaze and Tameka Murphy with Ashley Edwards and Ashleigh Leech kicking one conversion each. It was a big statement of intent from the Easts' side who have looked in dangerous form throughout 2019 to date.

Owls managed a couple of tries through Anna Korovata and Crystal Papalii, Wallaroo international Georgia O'Neill adding a conversion, but they were thoroughly outplayed in most facets of the match and will need a regroup and rethink if they are to challenge Easts for the trophy as Finals football approaches.

Easts will be looking to maintain their momentum this weekend as they welcome Tuggeranong Viqueens to Griffith Oval with the Viqueens coming into the match in decent form having seen off a plucky Wests 56-0.

The Vikings were always likely to gain the bonus-point victory they were looking for after scoring a brace of early tries but were made to work hard by Wests for the duration of the eight minutes, eventually running away with the score-line and crossing for ten tries with Sharon Waihape claiming two.

Wests are back in action again in Round 8 when they are hosts to Royals at Jamison Oval. Royals currently sit fourth on the five-team ladder with twelve points and could conceivably move up to third should results go their way on the weekend.

Meanwhile, Buildcorp Super W player Michaela Leonard has been included as one of ten uncapped players in Wallaroo Coach Dwayne Nestor's squad for the forthcoming two-Test series against Japan.

The 24-year-old is the only Brumby named for the Test series, but former ACT representative Millie Boyle has earned a recall. The Wallaroos will kick off the historic Test series against Japan in Newcastle on Saturday, July 13, before meeting again in Sydney on Friday, July 19.



The story of the 2019 First Division 1st grade season will require an entire chapter dedicated to Round 11. Gungahlin and Goulburn have been on a collision course for some time now, and this past weekend, they met, with the Eagles flying high at home, 36-19.

Indeed, it's hard to know who will catch the Eagles now atop the 3rd grade ladder. This latest result over the Dirty Reds surely makes them favourites for it all now with just a few fixtures left on the schedule.

ADFA and Royals didn't play the other top four matchup, so we move on to Hall where the Bushrangers put a beatdown on Easts, at their home ground no less. James Thornhill, Andrew McCoola and Conor O'Donoghue all bagged braces in the 79-0 rout, with outside centre O'Donoughue adding seven conversions to his tally.

Uni-Norths upset the pre-match form guide by beating RMC 34-0. RMC were just outside the playoff spots and would have leapfrogged Royals with victory but the Owls, sitting in the basement of the ladder came out and dismantled the Military college cohort thanks to an Andrew Galbraith double. Queanbeyan Whites kept their hopes of sneaking into the finals alive by squeaking by Wests at Jamison Enclosed Oval. The final score, 26-24 to the visitors was fair reflection of what was a hard-fought contest. Ultimately it was the boot of John Steele which decided the piece, his extra conversion the tiebreak with both sides scoring four tries each.

The final match of round 11 saw Cooma and Vikings play out a 28-28 draw. While Tuggeranong are still mathematically capable of making the top-four, both these teams are likely to be on the outside looking in come finals time.

West will look to make one last ditch effort to make the playoffs against Cooma and rounding out the fixtures is Easts clash with Vikings at Griffith Oval.

Gungahlin have already posted a round 12 victory against ADFA in a makeup game, so the pressure is on Goulburn to reply against Owls today. Royals face a tough visit to Hall while RMC will hope to bounce back against Queanbeyan.




