BUSINESS AS USUAL AT THE TOP END

It was business as usual in Round 11 of the Griffin Legal John I Dent Cup, with the top three sides all notching impressive wins. The tightest of contests was at Viking Park where Tuggeranong won out against the Uni-Norths Owls, 29-20.

Two tries from Will Sankey plus efforts from Max Bode and Ben Love from the Owls were enough to match Vikings four five-pointers from Jayme Field, Dean Wilson, Sam Thomas and Max Ravouvou, but the difference on the day came from the reliable boot of Isaac Thompson. Given that Uni-Norths have been impressive at times this year, and that Tuggeranong were without a bunch of frontline players, getting five points out of this game for Vikings is mildly impressive.

They're on a run, and Royals are back to their best it seems after suffering heavy to Vikings last week. Indeed, the Blue-Baggers 54-14 beat down of Wests couldn't really have come at a better time. If confidence may have been a problem going into the game, it certainly didn't seem like it.

From the get go, Royals looked every bit the side that had ripped off eight wins in a row. Lincoln Smiths try in the dying moments encapsulated Royals lethal edge against the Lions.

In a similar fashion, the Gungahlin Eagles seem to have shaken off their slip up against Royals a couple weeks ago, their latest bonus-point victory against Queanbeyan rubberstamping their intention to go all the way this year. Winning away to the Whites is never easy, and the Eagles were definitely made to work for their chocolates at Campese Field. Mack Hansen's hat-trick certainly leads the headlines, but Gungahlin dominance in the closer exchanges, particularly at scrum time, proved critical late in the piece.

The Eagles earn a week off for Round 12, but it doesn't get any easier for Queanbeyan. The Whites welcome Tuggeranong today, hoping to turn around their round five result against the Champions where they were ransacked, 50-29.

Wests will fancy their chances at home to Easts who are desperate for their first win of the season. The battle of the 'burbs is more of a wooden spoon playoff at the moment, but both sides have been looking to improve lately. The final clash sees Royals take on Owls, once again at Phillip Oval, a bonus-point win would send the Blue-Baggers top.



70 YEARS OF ROYALS RUGBY

This weekend the Canberra Royals family is coming together to celebrate their 70th anniversary. For 70 successful years, Royals have prided themselves for on- and off-field success, developing life-long relationships. They head to Phillip Oval where they will take on the Uni-North Owls in all grades.

The earlier grades kick off early to allow time for a Royals Legends v ACT Vets. This clash of titans of ACT rugby will be underway at 2.35, before the first grade game.

It is a fitting match for the Royals anniversary—taking on the club they separated from in 1949.

The tale goes that a row over new jerseys for North's third grade side, led Jack Waters and a group of young men to break away and form a new club. North's agreed and Canberra Royals formed with club colours of royal blue and white.

That season Royals entered two teams in reserve grade and were highly successful. In the decade following, the firsts played in nine grand finals and winning three times, including their first John I Dent Cup in 1954.

The Sixties saw Royals invest into growing junior rugby, paying dividends into future. Foundation player Keith Hawke was prominent in growing the

junior game, implementing a system where grade players coached junior teams. There were many who helped.

On-field success continued with Royals taking out four premierships over the decade, including trifecta between 1964 and 1966.

The Seventies proved to be a transition era for Royals, from early success to a golden generation. Royals focused on continuing to grow its nursery and forming pathways with schools and colleges in the Woden-Weston catchment. In 1979, Royals launched into a period of success not often seen, on the back of talent the club developed.

From 1979 to 1991, Royals took home eight John I Dents. Names from this period are now synonymous with Royals: O'Connor, Clarke, Didier, Taylor, Cornish, Kelsey, Thurbon. The list goes on. Innovation came in the form of fitness trainer Brian Burke. Dougal Whitton credits Bourke with not so much making Royals fitter, but giving them a psychological edge. A Bourkie fitness session now legend in the club.

Royals was at the front of rugby innovation and growing the game again during the Nineties. In 1992, Royals pulled together a women's team for the inaugural Australian women's rugby challenge.

The team tasted early success, a tradition that continues.

As the Nineties wore on Royals again looked to inject youth back into to the squad. Whilst Royals were not to taste premiership success falling at the final hurdle, the pathways continued to shine.

Royals has experienced some dark times over the course of their history. None darker then losing the licensed venue in the early 2000s putting club on the brink. The board made some tough decisions and the club survived. This hardship pulled the playing group and the wider Royals family together.

Signs that the situation was improving for Royals came through the late naughties and early teen years. It culminated in 2015 with Ben Johnston's iconic try, minutes after the full time siren has sound—ending a 24-year premiership drought. The mateship and passion on full display as the Blue Army descended onto the field, even for the conversion could take place.

Royals have continued writing themselves into the history of ACT Rugby, capturing the inaugural Bob Hitchcock Territory Shield in 2018.



Royals has a strong history of having player making representative sides. But, ask anyone who has put on the Royals Jersey and they will tell you there is something different that sets the club apart. The mateships run deep, bonds formed between generations.

And while they celebrate 70 years this weekend—you know Royals are keeping one eye toward the future.

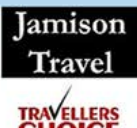

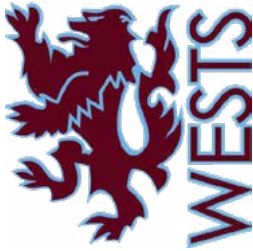

PERFECT TEN FOR TIGERS

The Taralga Tigers made it ten wins on the spin in the South Coast Monaro Second Division with a thumping 52-17 win over Batemans Bay Boars at Taralga Sports Field as they cemented their lead at the top of the pile. Another bonus-point win means the Tigers have now racked up 49 out of a possible fifty points this season to lead the way in the competition by a hefty fifteen points.

Dale Graham and Nicholas Bennett both scored hat-tricks for the Tigers who were in relentless form against the out-gunned Boars as the home team racked up eight tries in total. Brendyn Lonesborough had got the ball rolling for the home side with Thomas Croker adding the second try before Graham and Bennett got to work with their try haul. Joel Croker banged over six conversions as the tigers extorted their authority once more.

Bungendore Mudhooks closed in on the top four with a surprise 21-17 win over the Jindabyne Bushpigs whose slump in form continued at the Jindabyne Sports Ground. Lochlan Bannerman converted all three of the visitors tries, one of which was claimed by Isoa Komairasea, as the Mudhooks kept alive their finals ambitions with an important victory.

Crookwell Dogs moved back into third place on the ladder, having overcame a slow start to the season as they kept the Yass Rams scoreless with a 47-0 hammering at the Crookwell grounds. The Dogs scored seven tries, Liam Jones converting six of them, in their big win with Jones also finding his way across the try-line for a personal haul of seventeen -points.

Taking centre stage this evening will be the Rams and the Braidwood Redbacks whose Round 11 clash has been moved to GIO Stadium as a precursor to the Plus500 Brumbies Super Rugby Quarter Final fixture with the Sharks from South Africa. The big stage should inspire the teams to produce a decent showing on the perfect turf at the stadium.

Elsewhere, the Tigers will travel to Mick Sherd Oval to play the Bungendore Mudhooks with the Crookwell Dogs aiming to heap yet more misery on the floundering Jindabyne Bushpigs. Meanwhile, Captain Oldrey Park will be the venue for the Broulee Dolphins match against the Batemans bay Boars as the Dolphins look for their first point of the season.

VIKINGS STUN LEADERS OWLS



Tuggeranong Vikings caused a minor upset in Round 5 of the ACT Women's Rugby Championship when they saw off the Uni-Norths Owls, the league leaders, by 17-15 at Viking Park. The owls had won their first three matches of the season to take a lead at the top of the table whilst the Vikings had yet to taste success since 2019 but did enough to record a famous win.

Ema Masi and Paris Robinson crossed for two of the three home tries as the Vikings contained a star-studded Owls outfit. Wallaroos international Georgia O'Neill was on the score-sheet for the Owls with deadly goalkicker Samantha Wood ramming over a conversion and penalty, but the Vikings superior try-count of three to two proved to be enough.

The result is hardly likely to be terminal for the Owls who hold a two-point lead over Easts at the top of the standings. Royals women closed the gap to Easts above them to four points with their second win of the 2019 season, a 69-7 hammering of luckless Wests at Phillip Oval.

The newcomers to the Women's competition were game throughout the full seventy minutes

and never gave up but found themselves out-gunned and outclassed by a Royals team that are steadily building into a squad that looks capable of challenging for the championship when finals football eventually comes around a little later in the campaign.

Grace Kemp, who shone on her debut season for the Brumbies Women in the Buildcorp Super W championship, crossed the whitewash three times for the victorious Royals, claiming an energetic hat-trick. Ella Boundy followed Kemp across the line for two tries of her own with Skye Churchill also on the scoreboard. In total, the Royals claimed twelve tries in a decent performance that will fill them with confidence going forward.

This weekend sees two more fixtures in the competition and a chance for Royals to test their finals credentials when they welcome the Uni-Norths Owls to Phillip Oval on Saturday afternoon. Elsewhere, Wests meet Easts at Jamison Oval in an early morning kick-off in what should be a good battle with Easts aiming to close the gap on the top placed side.

DIRTY REDS DOMINANCE CONTINUES

Goulburn Dirty Reds continued to lead the way at the top of the First Division First Grade table after they secured a bonus-point win over Easts in Round 9 of the competition played last weekend. Jordan Lees claimed two of the eight tries that the league-leaders registered as they romped to a 46-0 away win at Griffith Oval to remain seven-points clear in first place.

ADFA are the closest challengers to Goulburn at present, and they also recorded a five-point win as they hammered the Hall bushrangers 49-7 at Dowsett Rugby Fields with Dom Chamberlain and Connor Hoban amongst those to claim tries. The loss was a debt to Hall's finals hopes as they dropped five-points behind Canberra Royals who are in fourth.

Royals eased themselves into that position with a 36-17 win over Wests at Phillip Oval with Edward Swann, Michael Dawson and Justin Vandenberg claiming three of their six tries as Wests were outgunned. The defeat does nothing for Wests chances of closing the gap on those above them as they slipped to

fifteen points off the pace and have probably seen their hopes of finals extinguished.

Johnny Pawa was in fine form with the boot for the Gungahlin Eagles, landing four conversions of the five tries the Eagles scored in a 33-12 away win over RMC at Portsea Oval. The Eagles victory means they are only a point off ADFA in second place and have a game in hand on the Academy side and two on the Dirty Reds who lead the way.

In other matches, the Quenabeyan Whites thrashed Cooma 41-7 whilst the match between Tuggeranong Vikings and Uni-Norths Owls, the teams ranked ninth and tenth on the league ladder at this stage of the season, finished in a gritty 5-5 draw between the pair.

There are only four matches this weekend in this Division as Wests meet Easts at Jamison Oval, the Royals welcome the Owls to Phillip Oval, Cooma take on the Gungahlin Eagles at Rotary Oval and RMC travel to Hall Sportsground to take on the Bushrangers.
