WEST-SIDE IS THE BEST

The action came thick and fast, but ultimately results for Round 12 of the Griffin Legal John I Dent Cup probably went how the pre-match form guide would have suggested. Western Districts and Easts played out an absolute thriller at Jamison Park on Saturday afternoon.

Despite the score-line not reflecting how the match truly unfolded, Easts had the upper hand for the majority of the match. Only for a couple of late tries to Wests to record only their second win of the season. The final score had Wests sneaking home 33-20 over Easts, both of which still sit at the bottom of the ladder despite playing out an absolute thriller.

Tuggeranong continued their strong form when they put away the Queanbeyan Whites 28-37 at David Campese Oval. The Whites again struggled with their set piece and discipline this week. Yellow cards to both Kieran Frost and Carl Elliot meant that they struggled to build momentum, and the points they gave away during those 10 minutes in each half ultimately made the difference.

The Vikings scrum really took over the match in the later periods, with a highlight for the forwards being an impressive pushover scrum. Two tries for each team in the closing stages gave the crowd something to cheer about, but the result was seemingly locked up from half time.

While Tuggeranong eventually came away winners, Queanbeyan will believe they have what it takes to beat them next time the teams face off if they can sort out a few issues. Phillip Oval has again been the scene of another Royals masterclass as the home side defeated the Uni Norths Owls in a convincing win. Coming off the back of a solid victory last week over Wests, the Royals premier grade side had confidence going into their game against the Owls at their home ground.



Rory Scott's hatrick certainly grabbed the headlines from the game, but the influence of the likes of Pedro Rolando and Ben Johnston certainly shone through, Royals holding on to the end despite some late attempts by the Owls to claw back some points.

Moving to this week, there are a couple tasty fixtures laid out for Round 13, the pick of the bunch being the matchup between Gungahlin and Vikings.

The Eagles have beaten the Champions twice already this year, but Vikings have hit their straps since then, so they'll fancy themselves out at Nicholls Enclosed. Elsewhere, Owls will look to re-establish their form with victory over Easts while Wests will hope to claim their first back to back win of the season against Queanbeyan Whites.

EAGLES AND VIKINGS — RECENT FOES

The rise of the Tuggeranong Vikings in the mid-to-late nineties was followed by a resurgence from the Eagles around the turn of the Century so, therefore, it was little surprise when the pair met up in the Grand Final in successive years in 2003 and 2004. Tuggeranong had defeated Daramalan (the Eagles previous incarnation) 14-6 in the 1995 decider, their only previous meeting before this pair of clashes. Eagles were triumphant in the first of these, 26-20 in 2003, but Tuggeranong gained their revenge twelve month's later with a convincing 33-13 success. 

RAMS DOWN REDBACKS AT GIO STADIUM

Yass Rams emerged as the victors from a gruelling eighty minutes under the floodlights of GIO Stadium last weekend, defeating the Braidwood Redbacks 28-17. Played before the Brumbies Quarter Final match-up with South Africa's Sharks, the Rams were always in control of a decent match that showcased some of the exciting quality that the South Coast Monaro Second Division can bring.

The Rams managed four tries in total, the latter two claimed in the second half by Lachlan Townsend and Scott Farthing to claim the points with what was a four tries to three success. Nominally the home side, the team from Yass converted all four of their five-pointers to keep up their hopes of finals football at the conclusion of the 2019 campaign.

It was business as usual for Taralga Tigers as they racked up yet another bonus-point win, as they hammered the Bungendore Mudchooks 49-7 at the Taralga Sports Field on Saturday afternoon to claim an eleventh win in succession. The home side scored seven tries with Samuel Conlon crossing for two of the scores, Joel Croker adding another and converting all seven to end with nineteen-points to add to his burgeoning tally.

Isaac Elliott, Jacob Johnson, William Hedley and Brendyn Lonesborough were the other Tigers try-scorers and with a visit to Yass Rams coming up this weekend, the Tigers will be hugely confident that they can keep their unbeaten record intact as the dominant force at this level.

Batemans Bay Boars were the biggest winners of the day, downing the luckless Broulee Dolphins 64-7 at Captain Oldrey Park, running in ten tries to go back home with the bonus-point safely under wraps. Lindon Blissenden crossed for a brace of tries for the Boars with James Thomas proving accurate from the kicking tee, landing seven conversions.

Meanwhile, the Crookwell Dogs appear to have rediscovered some form as they edged past the stuttering Jindabyne Bushpigs to win 29-22 at Crookwell Rugby union grounds on Saturday afternoon. The Dogs saw Danny Knight and Liam Jones score two of their four tires, Jones converting three and adding a penalty for good measure. Dylan Johnson almost matches Jones for kicking accuracy, converting two of the Bushpigs three scores and landing a penalty of his own.

Easts ran in seven tries on the day with Ashleigh Leach enjoying a more than satisfactory afternoon's work. She managed two tries, as did Kahurangi Leach, and kicked four conversions for a personal haul of eighteen.

It was the Zoe Kershaw show in response for the Wests Women's side, the centre bagging a hat-trick of scores for the beaten team with number eight Jane Morrison converting two of them. Newcomers to the competition this season, Wests are still searching for that elusive first competition point.

Their next opportunity to do so will be at Weetangera Oval this afternoon. Kick-off in that tie is at 12.30pm and should prove to be an absorbing clash.

Table-topping Easts meanwhile make the short journey to the Australian National University where the Uni-Norths Owls will provide the opposition. If Easts are to be serious contenders for the crown, then they need to prove themselves against their nearest challengers and could open a nice gap at the top should they come out victorious.

Owls were too good for Easts earlier in the season, winning 34-12 in the Round 2 encounter at the same venue, but Easts will feel their form has improved and that they are in with a genuine shout of coming home with the points.



Queanbeyan Whites are trailing even the chasing pack at this stage of the season, and they didn't do their chances of a run to the finals with defeat at home to the Vikings, though Tuggeranong still languish down in ninth.

Rounding out the round, RMC ransacked Hall, ranging in to the home sides ground and leaving with the points.


